

UK Tour Game - Day 9

Good Morning to one and all.

I hope you all had a good time at the seaside yesterday. I see one or two of you have caught the sun! I didn't see many of you swimming in the sea though!

Today we are off to Windsor, mainly to look around the Castle.

Windsor is a town on the River Thames in southeast England, just 23 miles west of London. It is home to Windsor Castle, a residence of the British Royal Family. Built by William The Conqueror in the 11th century, the castle was extensively remodelled by subsequent monarchs.

We will start the day with a tour of the Castle and then move on to see what else Windsor has to offer.

Don't forget to collect the Day 9 Treasure Hunt, see below, before you go.

Day 9 Treasure Hunt

This time we are going to travel by coach. The coach leaves from Trafalgar Square so we will use the underground again to get to Charring Cross, which is the closest tube station to Trafalgar Square.

We take the Circle line to the Embankment station and then change onto the Bakerloo line and go one stop to Charring Cross. From here it is a short walk to the Coach pick-up point. The coach is waiting, so climb aboard, find a seat and get comfortable. Off we go:-

Most of you seem to have fallen asleep and missed the last part of the coach ride from the M4 into Windsor itself. Don't worry it was similar to what you have seen already and a lot of traffic. It didn't take too long though.

We are being dropped-off in a car park close to the Castle, so it is time to go to Google Maps and enter 'Castle Car Park, Windsor, UK'. Zoom in close and 'drop-in' to River Street. With the Fish and Chip Shop behind you, turn right and head south until you get to Thames Street. This is the castle in front of you.

You get to the main entrance by turning right into Thames Street and then following the road round to the left. Turn left after the Harte & Garter into Castle Hill and the Castle Entrance is along on the left hand side.

On display in the castle is a masterpiece of miniature engineering, Queen Mary's Dolls' House 1921-4. Queen Mary's Dolls' House is a dollhouse built in the early 1920s, completed in 1924, for Queen Mary, the wife of King George V. It was designed by architect Sir Edwin Lutyens, with contributions from many notable artists and craftsmen of the period, including a library of miniature books containing original stories written by authors including Sir Arthur Conan Doyle and A. A. Milne.

I don't know about you, but I think it is time for some refreshment. So we will go back to Google maps, at the same point you left it and cross straight over Castle Hill into Church Street. There seems to be a lot of choice, with several different pubs and cafes. If you go to the end of Church Street and into Church Lane there is even more choice. Here is a sample of some of the choices:-

There seem to be plenty of tables free. Also there is another chance to buy some souvenirs and gifts if you wish.

When you are suitably refreshed, we will continue along Church Street and turn right into Church Lane. The building on your right is the Guildhall & Museum. We'll call in for a quick look:-

The Windsor & Royal Borough Museum is a registered/accredited, family-friendly and accessible small local history museum in a Grade 1 listed building completed in 1689. Come and discover the history of the town and the area. Listen to the stories of people who lived and worked here.

[Unfortunately there seems to be a glitch in Google Maps that prevents us from getting out of Church Lane and into the B3022 (High Street). You will therefore need to go back to map view and drop back again into Street View, at the same point, but on the B3022 line.]

We come out of Church Lane and turn right. At the end of the museum building there is a small lane called Queen Charlotte Street. This is the shortest street in Britain. Take a quick look, shouldn't take you long! :-

We keep going straight ahead, passed the castle to the bend at the start of Thames Street. On the other side of the road, at number 23 is Dr Choc's Windsor Chocolate Factory & Café. We'd better go and see what we can make out of chocolate:-

A little further along we turn left into River Street, where we were dropped off by the coach. Keep going along here till you get to the river. At this point you will see River Thames Boat Trip in front of you. You guessed it! Yes we have a trip booked:-
