Kerrisdale's rookie-laden representative bowls team has reached the semifinals of the Vancouver and District Top 10 mixed team competition.

The Top 10 is a straight knockout competition, made up of bowls club teams consisting of one single bowler, a pairs and triples team and a team of two-bowl fours.

Kerrisdale is led by team captain and singles bowler John Aveline. Jack Green and Rosemary Cryer make up the four-bowl pairs combo and Dianne Petrant, Simon Tang and Barrie Brown, who filled in for the absent Don Young, form the three-bowl triples. Tom Berridge, Peter Lee, Brenda Rhodes and Suphin Nakutnok play on the fours team.



KLBC won its opening match against a New Westminster side 4-0, winning all four games by handsome margins.



John had little trouble taking the singles matchup 21-9, while Jack and Rosemary pulled away in the final ends to win the pairs 16-10.

Dianne, Don and Simon had the closest game of the night but went on an 8-shot run in the last four ends to win by six shots. The all-rookie fours were in charge the whole way and won comfortably 19-8.

Two weeks later, the outcome against our second-round opponent from Vancouver club came down to shot differential.

Tied 2-2 after winning both the singles and triples by a combined total of 19 points, Kerrisdale took the contest with a +15 point differential with the help of two close two-point losses by both the club's pairs and fours teams.

The third-round semifinal will be played in Richmond on Friday, Aug. 5.

Kennedy won the final match of a three-game series against Luci Ewen, the 2019 under-18 Canadian national singles champion, at the Sidney Lawn Bowls Club on July 2.

The second-year Kerrisdale bowler took the eventual 25-and-under ladies champion to 26 ends before eventually falling 21-18 in the morning opener.


Skip Tom Berridge and new bowler Suphin Nakutnok also finished the day-long competition with a 3-1 record.
